BVYC Historical Article

The Big Fence Debate

For many years four local yacht clubs (BVYC, TYC, MRYC, & TSC) operated on lands and river front leased from the City of Toledo. The rents were nominal and as the value of the improvements and boats increased, fences were erected to limit access to the club grounds and prevent vandalism and theft.

On February 6, 1969 the Blade ran an editorial condemning the clubs for erecting fences after MRYC leased additional land in Walbridge Park for a pool. They built a six foot fence around the area and topped it with barbed wire. After residents and park users complained, the barbed wire at MRYC came down but it was allowed to remain at BVYC where the barb wire topped fence had been built some years earlier.

The Blade then took up a two week crusade about many aspects of the yacht club leases. It was determined that the clubs had no right to deny access to the club grounds to anyone who wanted to use them for "park purposes during park hours". Members Only signs at the gates were to be removed to comply with lease provisions.

Another question arose about the clubs discriminating against minorities and Jews. Reviews of club documents showed no discriminatory language and members stated that there were Jewish members at some clubs and that minorities had been guests at several clubs but that none had so far applied for membership.

The Blade also questioned the right of the clubs to exist on city land at all. Proposals were made to buy out the clubs and operate them as public marinas. The nominal rental fees that the clubs paid were also discussed, and soon after the rates were increased substantially.

Another proposal was for the city to sell the leased land to the clubs, and forty years later, it finally happened.


