#### From the Board of Trustees

The Board meets monthly on the third Wednesday of the month. The agenda is prepared in advance of the meeting; the purpose is to allow time for the Board members to review documents and prepare for the meeting. If you have business with the Board please notify the Board Chairman no later than 7:30 PM on the Sunday immediately preceding the Board meeting. Occasionally, the Board will have a Special meeting focused on specific topics and scheduled on short notice.

The Board recently approved that all exterior club doors shall remain locked at all times when not in use. The intent is to prevent non-members from entering the club without permission. Please help ensure the security of our club. This may be suspended during Homecoming or other special events.

One of the duties of the Board is the final interpretation of the Constitution & ByLaws.

Dock News: Dock & Harbor Rule 3. a) i) B)

A historical perspective: Going back more than 45 years up to about 5 years ago, our docks were all occupied with permanent dock holders. During this period many members waited 2 – 5 years to be awarded a permanent dock, depending on the size of their boat. Fortunately, Dock & Harbor rule 3 provided flexibility in allowing our dock space widths to change, over time, as the boats in either of the dock spaces of a well changed.

The width of a dock space is determined by subtracting the beam of the well's adjacent boat plus 3' 0" separation. Generally, as a narrower boat was assigned a dock space it allowed the adjacent dock space to become wider the next time it is posted for bid. It was very rare, if ever, that both dock spaces of a well were vacant. These vacant dock spaces have been posted at a fixed width, which has limited the intended flexibility. Currently, we have more than 20 vacant dock spaces, including four wells that have both dock spaces vacant. We're in an unfamiliar situation.

The Board has reviewed this situation and rendered an interpretation of the rule, as follows. When one dock space is not occupied "the beam of the boat properly occupying the well" will be 0' 0"; therefore the width of a dock space shall be the full width of the well, minus the 3' 0" separation. The adjacent vacant dock space will also have the same width. Moving forward, as these vacant docks are bid, the member with the most seniority will be awarded one dock. After the successful award, the width of the adjacent dock space will be re-posted at the total well width minus the newly awarded boat width plus 3' 0". The docks that are affected by this interpretation will be re-posted for bid on Wednesday, 3/13/19.

On a lighter note, please be courteous to our bar staff; they're at work when we are enjoying our club. I know I look forward to seeing their smiling faces on Friday evening following a long work week.

We have equipment that has to be prepared so it is ready for the launch. We have a yard that needs to be cleaned up along the fences, and buildings that will need to be maintained and painted. Our small building with the power washers needs a lot of attention.

There is a lot that everyone can come out and help with even if you do not have a boat and you like to work outside. This is also for the women members of the club that would like to work outside.

I will be having another class to certify members on the equipment. If you pass, your name will be put on the roster to run the equipment. I hope everyone will understand if I do not feel you are ready or able to run the equipment I will not put your name on the roster and the reason for that is that our equipment is getting older and it needs to be run properly and maintained properly.

The yard is going to be run a little different this year and if you have read your constitution and by-laws you will see where we are coming from.

Launching of boats can start before May 1st according to our by-laws. When your boat came out determines when you go in. Please everyone be mindful of this and if you are blocking someone that wants to go and they are ready to go in and your time of launch is up and you are not ready we will move you and charge you accordingly.

Boats this year will be launched every weekend up to June 1<sup>st</sup>, again according to the by-laws boats are to be in the water by this date. We will also launch boats every Wednesday up to this date as long as there is a crew to help or you provide your own help.

LAUNCHING OF BOATS WILL BE HANDLED AS FOLLOWS:

YOU WILL STAY AND HELP EVERYONE THAT IS ON THE LIST THAT DAY TILL THE END OF THE DAY.

IF IT IS YOUR BOAT YOU WILL CLEAN UP YOUR SHORING PUT ON THE PALLETT AND THE FORKLIFT DRIVER WILL PUT IT IN THE PROPER PLACE.

WORK HOURS WILL ONLY BE GIVEN IF YOU WORK AND REMEMBER YOU DO NOT RECEIVE WORK HOURS FOR LAUNCHING YOUR OWN BOAT.

ON THE BOARD UPSTAIRS THERE WILL BE GENERAL LAUNCH DATES ACCORDING TO WHEN YOU CAME OUT—IF YOU DO NOT REMEMBER WHEN YOU CAME OUT PLEASE JUST ASK.

The Yard rules and regulations and the sign up for launching will also be there.

AS YARD CHAIRMAN I ALSO HAVE BOATS TO GET READY BESIDES TAKING CARE OF THE YARD AND MEMBERS OF BVYC. I ALSO WANT TO ENJOY MY BOATS THIS YEAR AND THIS WHY WE ARE GOING TO TRY VERY HARD TO FOLLOW OUR RULES. HOPE EVERYONE UNDERSTANDS AND I DO UNDERSTAND THERE ARE CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES THAT COME UP THAT CAN NOT BE AVOIDED AND I WILL WORK AROUND THEM AS LONG AS I KNOW AHEAD OF TIME.




