

### **BVYC** Historical Article

### **The Crew Club**

Back in the mid 1960's there was very little for the children of club members to do while on the club property. We fished for crabs off the shore line bulkhead, played on the old **Ricky B** (a fish boat that was laid up in the yard for many years before being sold to Harrisons), and threw rocks into the lagoon (to the loud disproval of the adults). Indoors we played and ran around upstairs on the main deck where the jukebox was until the bar patrons yelled at us because the noise was deafening downstairs at the bar.

At some point the adults decided that we needed some form of organized distraction so they formed the Crew Club. This organization was for members children from ages 8 to 18 and was mentored by some of the adult members. Flo Higgins, Leo Drouillard, and Dick Legowski were some of the members devoting time to the kids. Club officers were elected and we began fund raising for a small sailboat for sail training and fun. Annual dues for the members were one dollar.

Another fund raiser was manning and organizing the coat room in the basement during the many dances, parties, and dinners held during the winter months. We accepted donations for hanging and retrieving coats for the attendees. As these parties usually ran pretty late it was a bleary eyed and tired crew by the end of the night.

Meetings revolved around teaching sailing theory and movies for the entertainment of the members. There was also an effort to procure games and a ping pong table for their use.

Eventually a sailboat was procured and practical sailing lessons conducted. In late August 1972 they put a four man crew headed by skipper Alan Ellison in the Carson Cup regatta at Put In Bay. Although they tried valiantly, they were out classed by more experienced competition and finished tied...for last place.

### From the Yard

The Yard is Opening Early and we are getting boats ready for launch. Reminder: If you were first out, you will be last in. If you were last out, you will be first in. If you are not ready to go in and your boat needs to be moved, you will be charged for the move. I have implemented a few new rules so the yard will run smoothly. There will be a sign up sheet as to what days boats will be going in. If you have a special time of day your boat needs to go in, Please call me and we'll work that out. All boats will be plummed before they are put in the water and there is no exception to this - so with that being said - No boat will go into the water without a call to me first so this can be done. As your boat is plummed, it will be entered into the computer that day so proper billing can be done. When you put your boat in, plan on helping others put their boats in. Work Hour Slips will be in the shed. Please fill these out at the end of day so they can be signed that day for accurate record keeping. 

# Discharge of Sewage and Waste



Signs like these are posted at pump-out stations in Ohio.

### On all Ohio waters except on Lake Erie, the Muskingum River, and the Ohio River:

- No person shall launch, moor, dock, operate, or permit to be operated any vessel with a sink, toilet, or sanitary system capable of discharging urine, fecal matter, contents of a chemical commode, kitchen wastes, laundry wastes, slop sink drainage, or other household wastes into the waters in this state.
- Such a sink, toilet, or sanitary system shall be removed, sealed, or made to drain into a tank or
  reservoir that can be carried or pumped ashore for disposal in an approved sewage treatment
  works.

On Lake Erie, the Muskingum River, and the Ohio River, all recreational vessels with installed toilet facilities must have an operable marine sanitation device (MSD) on board.

There are three types of MSDs.

- Types I and II MSDs are usually found on large boats. Waste is treated with special chemicals
  to kill bacteria before the waste is discharged.
- The Type III MSD, the simplest and most common, consists of holding tanks or portable toilets. Waste is to be discharged on shore into a pump-out station.

Federal regulations specify the type of MSD allowed.

- Vessels 65 feet and under may use a USCG-certified Type I, II, or III MSD.
- Vessels over 65 feet must install a USCG-certified Type II or III MSD.

U.S. Coast Guard-certified devices are so labeled except for some holding tanks, which are certified by definition under federal regulations.


