Article XI


Section 3. Nominating Committee: The Commodore shall appoint a Nominating Committee of five (5) Active members in good standing at least four (4) weeks prior to the annual election. The duties of this committee shall be to interview, select and recommend one (1) or more candidates for each of the various offices, as well as a slate of candidates for membership on the Board of Trustees. This committee shall present its recommendations one meeting before the election. At the conclusion of the report, nominations for all positions except Financial Secretary and Treasurer may be received from the floor. The nominations then will be closed. Any member nominated shall have been a member in good standing for at least two (2) years. The membership must be notified by mail of all nominations at least one week prior to the election.

Proposed addition: to follow above paragraph


Any nominee for the positions of Treasurer and Financial Secretary shall possess accounting experience through professional or volunteer work experience and/or a degree in accounting or finance. Any nominee shall also successfully pass an FBI background check. A successful background is defined as no felony convictions.

Prospective nominees shall submit their qualifying credentials to the Board Chairman prior to the August Board meeting. The Board shall review the credentials, and if approved, the prospective nominee must undergo an FBI background check. Upon receipt of the background check results, the Board Chairman shall notify the prospective nominee of the results. The Board Chairman shall inform the Nominating committee chairman of the prospective nominee(s) who have successfully passed the background check.



From the Board of Trustees :

As you may be aware, tragedy struck at Bay View Yacht Club early on the morning of July 3rd, as two boats caught fire and burned to the waterline. The boats were located in docks 71, owned by Bob Bedard, and 72, owned by John McAdams. After the fire was extinguished in Bob's boat it was removed from the water using our lift and set in the storage yard. John's boat sank at the dock and was later recovered on July 9th by a professional salvage company. Fortunately, no personal injuries were sustained during this incident. On behalf of our members, I extend our sympathies to Bob and John in the total loss of their boats.

Thank you to all of the members who responded and helped through this ordeal. A special Thank You goes to P/C Tony Blank who remained on site throughout the day of the incident. Tony was the point man for communication between the Board of Trustees and the United States Coast Guard, Ohio EPA, City of Toledo Environmental department, Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Toledo Fire Department and the club's insurance adjuster. Also, a special Thank You goes to Pam Smith of S&S Janitorial for responding quickly to call 911 and make numerous phone calls in an attempt to notify club members.

On a positive note, we learned from this incident. An Emergency Contact list, including the names and phone numbers of the Board members, has been posted behind the bar and on the bulletin board. The Dock Assignment committee will ensure that a *Permanent Dock Application Form* is completed, signed and on file for every member who has a dock. Also, the committee will post a list of all the docks with the name of the member whose boat is assigned. And, the Board is reviewing the club's insurance coverage.

If your boat was damaged as a result of the fire, please file a claim with your insurance company and then report the claim number to P/C Tony Blank. The Board is currently working through the affected insurance companies to have the burned boat removed from the yard.

On a different note, when a member wants to host a meal at the club, authorization shall be obtained from the Rear Commodore. All funds received shall be submitted to the Rear Commodore or Treasurer for bank deposit and expenses shall be paid via club check or club debit card.

The Board meets on the third Wednesday of the month. The agenda is prepared in advance of the meeting; the purpose is to allow time for the Board members to review documents and prepare for the meeting. If you have business with the Board please notify the Board Chairman no later than the evening of the Sunday immediately preceding the Board meeting.

Special Announcements

Boating Technology - You gotta love technology. Today we can text a buoy and receive water and weather data. I recommend you create a new contact called Weather Buoy 45165. The phone number is 866-218-9973. Then create a text message to Weather Buoy. In the text field, put in 45165 and hit send. That's why you put 45165 in the contact name so you remember what to put in the text field. In seconds you will receive weather and wave data from the buoy that sits out in front of Meineke's marina. I believe there are others as well but that's the only one I'm familiar with. Also, one of the best Apps I've found is called Sail Flow. It's meant for sail boaters but works great for any type of boating. It basically will tell you the forecasted winds for your area. Download the app from your phone store then launch it. You will see small arrows on a map. Touch on one of the arrows then click on forecast. Then you will see projected wind speeds and directions for the next week as well as the weather outlook. If you know of other Apps and boating technology you would like to share then forward to Jeff Palmer - nemo@bex.net for consideration in the next newsletter.


